About ARBOR

It was back in the Fall of 1948 that a few interested real estate brokers in Arlington, recognized the need to develop professionalism in their industry. The group began work that culminated in the organization of the Arlington Board of REALTORS®. On January 20, 1949, the big event took place at the Branding Iron Cafe on East Division, the first Officers were installed. Edgar Bird, President; D. M. Ramsey,



Vice President; and Betty Nelson, Secretary-Treasurer. The other charter members were Helen C. Wessler, R.J. Murray and Joe Elder.

Although few in number, this group was intrepid. They met every Friday at noon for lunch. Whatever they lacked, it wasn't "togetherness" or "consistency!" An occasional meeting was programmed with a speaker, and prospective members and interested business people were invited.

More than 70 years later, ARBOR has more than 3,000 members and covers SE Tarrant County, Ellis County and Hill County. In February of 2007, ARBOR moved in to their new facilities of more than 10,000 sq ft, after purchasing the land and going through the construction process. The new building offers rental facilities, lease-space for businesses and comfortable event and classroom settings.

Year in Review

A review of 2020 for some might focus on the disruptive nature of dealing with a pandemic, forcing delays, adjustments and, sadly, many cancellations to nearly every activity, service or event. There is no doubt that 2020 was different and significant adjustments were made. But even this quick review yields an impressive summary of what dedicated volunteer leaders, members, staff and community leaders can accomplish when working together.

MLS & TECHNOLOGY

MLS & NTREIS

The MLS Dept provided 42 MLS-Tech Classes at no charge for members during 2020.

Technology Upgrade: We introduced "ABBI" a chatbot to the website. The chatbot helps visitors navigate to important sections of the website.



TECHNOLOGY OFFICE SUPPORT

COVID-19 was not the only "virus" to hit ARBOR, as we were subjected to a "Ransomware" attack, disabling the server, staff support documents and two workstations. The probable cause for the ransomware attack was discovered and repaired with firewall settings. Additional utilities were added to the server and workstations to monitor for malware and ransomware.

Speaking of added security, three additional security cameras were added to our system on outside of the building, for a total of eight cameras.

Remote working by the staff was implemented a few times during the year. All support was maintained to the members during this period with minimal expenditure for hardware and only a few noticeable disruptions outside of the accommodations made for social distancing and COVID-19 safety precautions.

With the retirement of Tom Hill, Walt Loonam started as MLS/IT Director.

MLS & NTREIS

The Clear Cooperation Policy was added to the rules in May 2020. This policy outlined timeframes for adding listings to the MLS and modified the "Coming Soon" status.

While compliance remains an important element of providing good data, there were minimal fines issued in 2020, as NTREIS advised an "educational period" for warnings until Jan. 2021. An ARBOR MLS fine of \$100 for listing agent entering themselves incorrectly as Buyer Agent when closing listing was implemented and will be enforced in 2021.

NAR MLS Committee approved recommendations for local MLS's to add procedures for monitoring member MLS violations, procedures for warning and fining members and operational procedures for sending violations and reprimands.

NTREIS moved MLS services to the AWS "cloud." Matrix updated to Matrix X version, updated to new flash-free Realist tax.

NTREIS MLS increased to 43,550 Users in 2020, with the addition of Northwest Louisiana Association of REALTORS® 1,200 members joining the family.

ARBOR will work closely with NTREIS to monitor the NAR/DOJ agreement and other pending legal issues.

ADVOCACY

TREPAC nearly met goal as investments totaled \$98,288. Being named an Essential Service by Gov. Abbott and most local authorities was a big win and testament to our Advocacy in action.

The Government Affairs Committee, led by Chair Shannon Ferry-Moser, remained busy throughout 2020. Building relationships and strengthening our voice is our goal and while social distancing presented unique challenges for our normal GAC activities, we adapted and moved forward.

COMMUNICATIONS

The hiring of Art Garcia as ARBOR's first Director of Communications & Events in August 2020 led to several sweeping changes in how we communicate to our members and external audiences. Though more improvements are on tap in 2021 as prescribed by the Strategic Plan: 2021TEAM, groundwork was laid in 2020 to take advantage of ARBOR's current communications tools and procedures.

Press releases generated by ARBOR, including release of Third Quarter Housing Stats and hiring of Walt Loonam as Director of MLS/IT, were covered by the news media, such as the Fort Worth Business Press and newsbreak.com, and were promoted heavily by the City of Arlington.

Social Media was also used extensively to promote ARBOR's message and reach. Facebook followers grew to 2,394 in 2020, with 143,990 total impressions on ARBOR's page. Twitter generated 32,456 impressions during the year.

Treasurer's Report

Breakdown of ARBOR's earnings and expenditures for 2020

The State of ARBOR is STRONG. 2020 was a very strong year for the ARBOR and NTREC bottom lines.

ARBOR and NTREC revenue was up as membership numbers increased to 3,117 in 2020 from 2,893 the previous year. ARBOR dues revenue and MLS subscriptions rose and NTREIS participation expanded.

Expenditures were also down significantly, as numerous planned events and services were curtailed or cancelled altogether. Our reserve account portfolio also significantly rose, rising 33%. The Capital Improvement Committee is revising the Investment Policy to ensure continued protection of these sacred funds and the way they are managed.


